Motion Title: Trade Union Congress (Minimum Wage) Motion

Motion Resolves:

That, in accordance with the Trade Union Congress the Union does: -

- Commit to by 2030 having the minimum wage as 75% of the median hourly wage
- Commit to acting on the TUC's recommendation of a £15p/h minimum as soon as practicable.
- Commit to promoting the Unionisation of it's employees and not taking any action to dissuade any such Unionisation
- Commit to supporting the TUC wage campaign.

Motion Notes:

This Union notes the divergence of the statutory minimum wage from post-war growth figures as noted by the Trade Union Congress

That the Trade Union Congress, the body representative of the Trade Unions of Britain, has considered that the wage provided at statutory minimums is insufficient for a normal person to live with a respectable work-life balance especially with the cost-of-living crisis that is currently being experienced.

That as a Union, and therefore as part of the Union movement, we should support lower income workers especially considering that many of our members are in low-paid insecure roles.

That this Union in its commercial aspect pays less than the TUC's goal.

Motion Believes:

A change in respect of minimum wage for the Union will improve conditions for our members who are also employees of the Union.
