

Union President

The Union President will be an equal member of the Union's Sabbatical Officer team responsible for representing and championing the rights and views of all 17,000+ students at the University of Stirling.

The University of Stirling Student Union President is a fixed-term 12-month elected role, based in Stirling, with an annual salary of £20,800 (28 days holiday pro rata). Sabbatical Officers will be working around 35 hours a week, with some weekend and evening work, depending on the needs of the role and priorities for the year.

All newly elected Sabbatical Officers must be available to begin their roles from 1st June 2023 for a full-time induction and handover period. The induction will continue throughout the summer months with training and introductory meetings.

Am I eligible to stand for Union President?

Any matriculated University of Stirling student can stand in the Union Elections, whether you are in the middle of your studies or due to graduate in June 2023.

If you are a mid-studies Undergraduate, if elected you will need to arrange to take a year-long leave of absence from your studies from June 2023 and return to your degree in June 2024.

If you are a Postgraduate Taught student, we can support the conclusion of your programme alongside your elected role.

What does the Union President role involve?

- Be the overall representative, spokesperson and ambassador of the Union; to the University, media and external agencies.
- As part of the Sabbatical Officer team, provide the overall political leadership of the Union.
- Support consultation with the student body in order to represent their interests appropriately and maintain close links with the local and national community on issues of mutual concern.
- Deliver change projects and campaigns based on your manifesto.
- Ensure the implementation of, and adherence to, an effective [Equality, Diversity and Inclusion policy](#).

- Be the main point of contact and provide support to the Equalities Volunteer Officers and campaigns to ensure the provision of appropriate events for these groups and their enhanced representation.
- Discuss with the Executive Council any response to Government consultations and actions on behalf of the Union.
- Attend all appropriate training events and conferences to ensure familiarity with their role and current issues affecting students.
- Act as a delegation leader to all NUS conferences and vote for all full-time positions of NUS on behalf of all students.

I want to stand for Union President, what next?

1. Submit Nomination

Nominations will open at **10:00 GMT on 31st January 2023**, you can submit your nomination online through stirlingstudentunion/elections where you'll be asked to provide:

- Your candidate photo
- Your manifesto
- Download, complete and return the Officer Code of Conduct form to natalie.hay@stir.ac.uk

The deadline for you to complete your nomination is **12:00 GMT on 14th February 2023**.

2. Nomination Confirmation

Once your nomination has been submitted and you have returned your completed Officer Code of Conduct form, we will confirm your nomination via email.

3. Candidate Briefing

Following the close of nominations, you will be invited to a Candidate Briefing where the Deputy Returning Officer shall communicate all important information to you on the Election process and answer any questions. If you cannot attend this meeting, you can send a representative on your behalf.

5. Campaigning and Voting Period

Campaigning begins at **10:00 GMT on the 21st of February**. Voting then opens at **10:00 GMT on the 28th of February** and closes at **17:00 GMT on the 2nd of March** with results being announced the following day.
