Engagement Volunteer Officer

The Engagement Volunteer Officer shall sit on the Union's Executive Council, alongside the Sabbatical Officers, representing and championing the rights and views of all 17,000+ students at the University of Stirling.

The University of Stirling Student Union Engagement Volunteer Officer is a fixed-term voluntary elected role, operating within the Education Zone. The Volunteer Officer roles are designed to be flexible and fit around your studies, with all core responsibilities taking no more than 10 hours a month.

All newly elected Volunteer Officers will immediately begin their roles following the Autumn Election and will be supported with induction and training throughout.

Am I eligible to stand for Engagement Volunteer Officer?

For the Volunteer Officer roles, you need to be a matriculated University of Stirling student at the time of the Union Elections, and until June 2024 at least.

What does the Engagement Volunteer Officer role involve?

- To work directly with the Vice President Education and Faculty Officers to continually promote and develop the academic representative network.
- To work with the relevant Sabbatical Officers and the student body to create a climate of active engagement through consultation with students in order to secure educational change.
- To plan, develop and implement education-related campaigns, events and materials to better the students' experience of students at Stirling.
- Deliver change projects and campaigns based on your manifesto.
- Ensure the implementation of, and adherence to, an effective <u>Equality</u>, <u>Diversity and Inclusion policy</u>.
- Attend all appropriate training events and conferences to ensure familiarity with their role and current issues affecting students.

1. Submit Your Nomination

Nominations will open at **10:00 BST on 29th August 2023**, you can submit your nomination online through Students' Union Website where you'll be asked to provide:

- a. Your candidate photo
- b. Your manifesto*
- Download, complete and return the Officer Code of Conduct form to natalie.hay@stir.ac.uk

The deadline for you to complete your nomination is 12:00 BST on 2nd October 2023.

* You'll have until **17:00 BST on the 4th October 2023** to edit and finalise your manifesto.

2. Nomination Confirmation

Once your nomination has been submitted and you have returned your completed Officer Code of Conduct form, we will confirm your nomination via email.

3. Candidate Briefing

Following the close of nominations, you will be invited to a Candidate Briefing where the Deputy Returning Officer shall communicate all important information to you on the Election process and answer any questions. If you cannot attend this meeting, you can send a representative on your behalf.

4. Candidate Support

There is support available to all candidates, including access to a range of candidate guides which can be found here.

We would also encourage Volunteer Officer Candidates to arrange a time to speak with the current Sabbatical Officers or a member of staff within the Students' Union. You can arrange this one-to-one meeting via the <u>Union Elections Booking page</u>. You can use this meeting to find out more about the Volunteer Officer role, and the Students' Union can offer advice on your manifesto and campaign planning while answering any of your questions.

5. Campaigning and Voting Period

Campaigning begins at 10:00 BST on the 10th October 2023. Voting then opens at 10:00 BST on the 17th October 2023 and closes at 17:00 BST on the 19th October 2023 with results being announced the following day.
